The DFG Research Training Group focuses on the impacts of social and psychological services work on its addressees. Consequences are deliberately defined broadly as both intended and unintended consequences and side effects of social services work. The DFG Research Training Group offers the doctoral candidates an international setting. The involvement of socio-pedagogical, psychological, sociological, and other associated disciplines also makes it highly interdisciplinary.

Doctoral researchers working on the subject area of the Research Training Group have the opportunity to participate as external participants. External participants will be able to take part in the entire qualification and supervision program. It consists of regular colloquia, group meetings and workshops on excellence and career development. In the case of external participants, the Research Training Group will not finance the doctoral position. Participation is possible from 01.04.2023.
